SLURRY POTHOLE MUCK OUT (#824) Cooperative project with AZGFD, ADBSS April 4th - 6th 2025

Location:

GMU 15D Black Mtns Approximate GPS coordinates of camp site: N35.18074, W114.44648 Approximate GPS coordinates for project site N35.16314, W114.40062

From Phoenix or Tucson: Go to Kingman AZ. I-40 then proceed north on Hwy 93 out of Kingman 4 miles to AZ hwy. 68 proceed west on hwy. 68, 20.5 miles to mile post 6.5 head south on Buck wash Rd. 1 mile to ADBSS camp site.

Project Description:

Muck out all sand and debris from existing potholes.

Difficulty of Hike:

We will carpool in vehicles 3.70 miles then ½ mi. moderate hike to project site.

Special Advisories: All Volunteers wishing to participate in one of our projects will need to access the new AZGFD Volunteer Website located at http://volunteer.azgfd.gov/adbss/ to create a Volunteer Account and password, join the ADBSS User Group and access and sign the Volunteer Registration Form (including the Parental Consent Form if applicable). After the project is complete (and within 5 days) all volunteers should return to this website to record to record and log in the volunteer hours they worked on the project. For your convenience, this flyer contains a QR code to access the AZGFD Volunteer Website with your mobile device. A hyperlink to the AZGFD Volunteer Website is also posted on our website under the projects tab or you may use the bolded address above into your browser.

- 1. All project participants need to attend and check in during the morning safety briefings.
- 2. Please bring charcoal, firewood or propane stoves for cooking/heating. Do not use or destroy native vegetation.
- 3. The road to campsite is accessible by high clearance two-wheel drive vehicles.
- 4. Please bring your own water and remove all your trash.
- 5. This project is funded by the Bighorn Sheep Special Tag Fund.
- 6. Please follow the map and do not drive off existing roadways.
- 7. Campsites should be not located more than 50 feet from existing two track roads in and around the camp area.
- 8. Fire rings and vehicle tracks leading to camps should be raked out when leaving the project.

General Advisories:

This is a remote high desert area, and the possibilities of life-threatening injuries exist. Volunteers should have a reliable vehicle, be in good physical condition and comfortable hiking and working in rugged terrain. Volunteers should bring and wear protective clothing and footwear, a sack lunch, rain gear, sunscreen and water (enough for the whole day) to the project site. Parents or guardians must maintain direct control and supervision of any minors on the project at all times. Young children and pets are discouraged. Projects will take place regardless of local weather conditions. ADBSS projects feature a light Friday evening meal, a catered Saturday evening meal and Sunday breakfast.
